
## Reversed Unified Braille Codes {brAym} in Arabic English and French



- **brAym** table includes **7 lines and 64 symbols** made by exchanging dots in **brAy** cell columns.
- Each line contains 10 symbols except the seventh line which contains only four symbols.
- The symbols of the first line are repeated in the next 3 lines and lowered in the 5<sup>th</sup> line.
- The symbols of the first line are used as Arabic numerals (1-9, 0) when preceded by (#).
- The {**Taha**} alphabet uses geometric Arabic letters and is written from right to left.
- The {Taham} alphabet uses inverted Geometric letters and is written from left to right
- The {brAym} alphabet is the opposite of {brAy} and is written from right to left as {Taha}.
- Universal Phonetic Alphabet (UPA) includes 3 compatible alphabets {Taham wAw brAy}.
- The English {**wAw**} alphabet represents the small and capital Latin matching letters {**ImI**}.
- {Taha} and {brAym} are recommended for writing Arabic texts from right to left. {Taham} and {brAy} are recommended for writing English and French texts from left to right.
