

For writing Arabic, English, or French texts equally in both directions we use the geometric method (**Taha**) with Arabic geometric letters, the writing Arabic way (**wAw**) with Latin letters matching geometric letters (**ImI**), and the (**brAy**) method with unified Braille letters matching geometric letters.

The following is a verse of poetry written in English letters (E), <mark>in reversed geometric</mark> <mark>letters</mark> (Taham),</mark> in Latin matching letters (lml), and <mark>in (brAy) letters. All of them are</mark> from left to right

English Geometric words consist of static or dynamic phonetic consonant letters. Dynamic letters are followed by either short horizontal movements (a, u, i, e, o) or long vertical movements (A, U, I, E, O) called in Arabic (Fathah, Dummah, Kasrah, Kashah and Offah) and (Mad Fath, Mad Dum, Mad Kasr, Mad Kash and Mad Off).
